Please note the following arrangements for the IPCC Open Meetings during inclement weather:-

- (i) Meetings would continue to be held when Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal No. 1 or No. 3 is hoisted, or Amber or Red Rainstorm Warning is issued.
- (ii) A Council meeting would be cancelled if, within two hours before the scheduled time of the meeting, it is known that a No. 8 or higher Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal or a Black Rainstorm Warning will be issued soon or is in force. The Secretary-General would arrange another meeting date in consultation with the Chairman.
- (iii) If, during a Council meeting, No. 8 or higher Tropical Cyclone Warning is hoisted, or Black Rainstorm Warning is issued, or it is known that a No. 8 or higher Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal or a Black Rainstorm Warning will be issued soon, the Member presiding at the meeting would decide whether to adjourn or continue with the meeting.
- (iv) The Member presiding at the meeting would decide whether to adjourn or continue with the meeting if other unforeseen circumstances arise.
