⁽iii) If, during an open meeting, No. 8 or higher Tropical Cyclone Warning is hoisted, or Black Rainstorm Warning is issued, or it is known that a No. 8 or higher Tropical Cyclone Warning Signal or a Black Rainstorm Warning will be issued soon, the Member presiding at the meeting would decide whether to adjourn or continue with the meeting.

⁽iv) The Member presiding at the meeting would decide whether to adjourn or continue with the meeting if other unforeseen circumstances arise.
